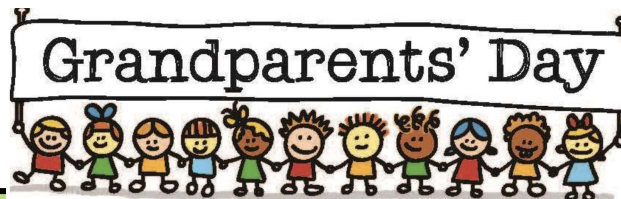
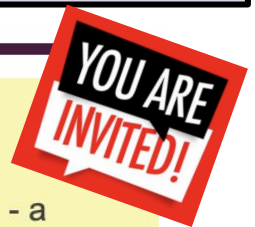
A Look Ahead...
